 If you plan on fussy cutting motifs, more fabric may be needed. For the Tumbling Blocks pattern, prints can be used with solids. When doing so, simply ensure you maintain contrast (light, medium, dark) between the fabrics. The contrast between the fabrics is key to the optical effect of the Tumbling Blocks pattern.

Fabric scissors

- Micro serrated scissors cut down on fraying and ensure precision cuts for hand piecing.
- Recommended: <u>Karen Kay Buckley Micro Serrated Six Inch</u> <u>Scissors</u>*

Mechanical pencil


- Optional: If any of your fabrics are dark you will need a marking tool such as a white chalk pencil.
- Recommended: <u>BIC Velocity Strong Lead Mechanical Pencils</u>*

Hand sewing needle

- Milliners #11 is recommended, but it is more important that you use a needle you are comfortable with for a running stitch. A thinner needle, such as #10 or #11, is easier to work with and will make the stitching more comfortable. While larger needles are sometimes easier to thread, they will slow down your stitching and put more stress on your hands.
- Recommended: Jen Kingwell Milliner's Size 11 Needle*

Thread for piecing

- Aurifil 40 or 50 weight in a neutral color that coordinates with your chosen fabrics.
- Recommended: Aurifil 50 weight white cotton thread*





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Templates for pattern

- If you already have acrylic templates for an EPP project, you can use those for preparing fabric. If not, you can use cardboard or template plastic for making templates with the provided pattern.
- Recommended: Perfect Heat Resistant Template Plastic by Karen Kay Buckley *

• Pins

- Thin pins, such as silk or applique pins are ideal, but it is more important is that you are comfortable working with the pins throughout the project.
- Recommended: <u>Taylor Seville Magic Pins Applique Extra Fine</u>*

Iron and pressing mat

- Recommended iron: I prefer the Oliso Mini Pro Iron to the fullsize Oliso iron. The Mini heats up quickly, is easy to manuever into small places, and takes up less space on my work table. Join our giveaway at a chance for a free Oliso iron!
- Recommended pressing mat: <u>Oliso Multi-Mat Felt Pressing</u> <u>Pad</u>*

• Quarter inch ruler (optional)

 Recommended: Jen Kingwell Simple Seam Allowance Wheel* or <u>Quilter's Rule Quick Quarter Ruler</u>*

Sandpaper board (optional)

- Recommended: Jen Kingwell Sandpaper Board*

Seam Roller (optional)
